

Project Progress and Milestones

Progress

The Stanmore Building (TSB) is the first building to be built as part of the hospital redevelopment on the Stanmore site. The TSB accommodates Adult Acute and Children & Young People wards, with embedded therapy and MDT areas.

On the ground floor, there is space for staff, visitors and patients with a coffee shop and Childrens' Activity Centre.

The new state of the art facility reflects the medical excellence that the RNOH is renowned for, enhancing patient experience and providing staff with an improved working environment. The inpatient facility has 50% of single rooms across each floor, providing patient privacy and dignity; improving patient safety; improving rest and recovery and enabling a safer and more efficient bed base.

The wards in the new building are:

First Floor (CYP)

Sir William Coxen Children and Young Peoples Unit

Second Floor (Adult)

The London Irish Ward

Third Floor (Adult)

Duke of Gloucester Ward

Fourth Floor (Private)

RNOH Private Care

The contractor, Balfour Beatty, started construction in October 2016 and the Trust took occupation of the building in August 2018. After a period of commissioning the building became operational in December 2018.
